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Driving Assessment and Rehabilitation

Our team performs a comprehensive clinical and on-the-road driving evaluation. This helps our therapists make strategy, equipment and safety training recommendations to you and your patient.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS

Patients are assessed on the following:

- Ability to use arms and legs to perform functional tasks.
- Visual perceptual assessment.
- Map reading and cognitive skills.
- Traffic sign identification and rules of the road.
- Behind-the-wheel assessment.
- Vision screening using the porta glare, which evaluates night and peripheral vision.
- Reaction time.
- Recommendations on accommodating hand controls, gas pedal adjustments, etc. for vehicle.

PATIENT CRITERIA

- Must have written doctor's referral for occupational therapy to assess driving ability.
- Must have a current driver's license or permit for at least a year.
- Must have driven in the last year.
- Must have doctor send results of the most recent medical exam indicating there are no medical complications that would affect driving ability (i.e., seizures).
- Must bring eyeglasses to the appointment if they've been prescribed.
- Must be seen on an outpatient basis (certain exceptions may apply).

Patients referred to the program may include people with mild strokes, those who've experienced head injuries, amputees, paraplegics, MS, ALS and senior citizens.

Services are typically non-reimbursable and must be paid at the time of appointment. Each patient should check with his or her insurance to determine coverage.
