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Outpatient Neuro Rehabilitation

WHO WE ARE

Carle Outpatient Neuro Rehab, formerly known as Carle Community Re-entry or CCR, works almost exclusively with individuals who have acute or chronic neurological disorders, such as brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, Parkinson's, multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy and amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. Generally, we see adults, but those under 13 years of age with a neurologic diagnosis may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

We have an experienced team of physical therapists, occupational therapists and speech language pathologists, many with additional specialty certification.

WHAT WE DO

We provide focused, patient-centered interventions targeted to the individual's impairments and goals.

These interventions may include:

- Wheelchair mobility and management.
- Transfer training.
- Gait training.
- Balance training.
- Basic and essential activities of daily living.
- Return to driving.
- Assisted or augmented communication.
- Community reintegration (including shopping or recreational interests).
- Return to work or school.

We offer specific interventions for patients with Parkinson's via LSVT Loud, Speak Out and LSVT Big programming, as well as weekly Speak Out/ Loud Crowds. Our grant helps us host weekly maintenance sessions for those who have completed the Speak Out program.

HOW WE'RE DIFFERENT

Our program differs from more traditional orthopedic-focused outpatient settings in a few ways. These include:

- Access to various technologies, equipment, and resources benefit neurologically impaired patients. Many are unique to Carle Foundation Hospital. These include an Activities of Daily Living (ADL) suite, complete with kitchen, laundry, living room, bedroom and full bathroom with a tub/shower, along with the following:
 - Motomed (2)
 - Nustep
 - Lite Gait PBWS system
 - Bioness Vector PWBS system
 - Sit-to-stand lift
 - Tilt table
 - Vector Base system
 - Hoyer lift
 - Jintronix
 - Lymphedema pumps
 - Speech biofeedback unit
 - Driving simulator
 - Standing frame
- Interdisciplinary team meetings with our supervising psychiatrist to discuss issues or concerns, including barriers, overall progress, equipment needs and any revisions to the plan of care.
- Individuals participating in the program can receive driving assessment and retraining in a safe environment through a two-hour, driving simulator evaluation. This combines the Occupation Therapy Driver Off-road Assessment Battery with behind-the-wheel simulation, which can help identify impairments and determine if the patient is safe for actual driving. Occupational therapists can then use additional targeted interventions with the simulator.
